Mixage Fou (Crazy Mix) Chicago Sound Bank and Mixage Fou International 80 Second Sound Competition

Mixage Fou and the Midwest Society for Acoustic Ecology invite you to participate in the 6th Annual Mixage Fou (Crazy Mix) Sound Bank and the 6th annual Mixage Fou International 80 Second Sound Competition.

This call is in two parts:

1. Mixage Fou Chicago Sound Bank: Urban Wilderness

What is "wild" about life in the city? How does nature in the city sound? What sounds define a city's identity? The MSAE invites you to submit original field recordings that reflect and reveal the diverse soundscapes of Chicago and vicinity. Materials submitted to the Sound Bank must be covered by a Creative Commons license as they may be used by participants of the International Sound Competition part of the call (see below). Recordings should be as high quality as possible and suitable for processing as source materials. Deadline for submission is September 27. See below for submission details.

2. Mixage Fou International 80 Second Sound Competition

Beginning on October 4 all sounds in the Mixage Fou Sound Bank (sounds from Chicago and from around the world) will be available for the creation of original sound pieces in the following categories: stereo, binaural (headphone 3D sound), surround 5.1, surround Auro 3D 9.1 (height consideration). All creative digital and analog sound techniques are allowed, but only sounds from the Sound Bank may be used. Works may be music compositions, sound narration, soundscapes, crazy mixes, etc. The duration is limited to 80 seconds. Sound compositions should be uploaded directly to www.mixagefou.com. The deadline for submission of original sound pieces is November 16.

Sound Bank Submission Details

- Sound files should be 10 minutes or less in duration.
- Sound files should be 48 kHz / 24 bit.
- Surround sound files: send each channel as a separate wav file with information in a text file.
- Sound files should be normalized using new R128 standard. More information on this normalization standard may be found at the following links:

Sound files not in the R128 format will be batch converted to the R128 standard after submission.

Please name your sound files based on the parameters of frequency, dynamics, and duration as follows:

Frequency: wide or narrow range; if narrow, specify high, middle, or low Dynamics: wide or narrow range; if narrow, specify loud, medium, or soft

Duration: specify in *minutes* and *seconds*

Separate parameters with underscores (_), elements within parameters with hyphens (-). Thus a 90 second sound file with a wide frequency range and a narrow, soft dynamic range, will be named: wide_narrow-soft_1-30.wav

Please use all lower case letters, and keep parameters in order: frequency, dynamics, duration.

Please include the following additional information in a text file:

Your name

File name(s)

General or individual description of sound files including when and where the recording was made, equipment used, etc. (optional)
